President's Letter

Dear Woodcreek Neighbors,

We begin 2019 with good and bad news.

Good News

The good news is, thanks to you, the Woodcreek Neighborhood Association (WNA) members, we were able to accomplish numerous projects last year. Among them:

- ✓ Improve the neighborhoods, which in turn has increased the property values of your homes.
- ✓ Address concerns of residents that fall within our abilities as a neighborhood association and refer problems to appropriate departments of the city for those outside of our area.
- ✓ Maintain common areas and continue to work to improve them, making Woodcreek a better place to live. What's left to do you ask? LOTS! Like this project we have almost completed: Thanks to the yearlong efforts by WNA volunteers, *Oncor is going to replace about half the light poles and paint the others throughout Woodcreek*. Oncor pays for the pole replacements and WNA must pay to have the remaining poles primed and painted. The fee for priming and painting is \$200.00 per light pole. Total cost is \$2,400.

Bad News

So far, we have only received 110 new and renewing memberships for 2019, which is the **lowest membership number in 4 years.**

Have we done something wrong?

We try not to bombard you, our neighbors, with numerous flyers and emails, but we need your support. We have the lowest membership dues and one of the most active associations of any neighborhood in Carrollton. Earlier I mentioned the light pole project. Woodcreek Neighborhood Association will pay \$2,400 for painting. The only revenue we generate is from membership dues. Without the replacement and painting of the poles the fiberglass will continue to splinter and deteriorate, endangering everyone who touches one. Look at them next time you pass one.
