### **President's Letter**


The Woodcreek Neighborhood Association Board of Directors is following the CDC guidelines and is not meeting in person during the COVID-19 crisis. Yet, we continue to work on your behalf to better our neighborhood.

The safety of our neighborhood is a top priority. We've discussed the idea of security cameras at our entries. I met with a company and I know that for now, this is not something we can afford as we are a volunteer neighborhood association (we don't

have mandatory dues). We have four entries into our neighborhood and two cameras per entry are required. Each camera set up would be \$2,000 per year or \$16,000 per year to secure all entries with incoming and outgoing cameras. Our current annual income cannot support an expense at this level.

Our City Liaison, Al Overholt, continues to work diligently with the city to advocate for street repairs. Woodcreek is especially bad and the temporary fixes are now failing. All is working to get more repairs this fall. We'll update you as we know more. Also, the current speed humps on Woodcreek are no longer used by the city. We'll be presented with some options from the city as the repairs get closer. Residents on Woodcreek will be surveyed about 1) No speed bumps or 2) Standard speed bumps used currently?


