President's Letter

Dear Woodcreek Neighbors,

It's hard to believe we are heading into fall already! It has been a busy year for the Woodcreek Neighborhood Association and thanks to each of you we have been able to accomplish several major projects.

The largest project was the new Woodcreek north entrance sign. This project took a year and a half to complete, beginning with the grant application in 2017. Thanks to Al Overholt and Liz Messner for spearheading the project and all of you WNA members for your support.

This new sign is much more visible, energy efficient and contemporary in style, and id set back from the road to allow cars better visibility to oncoming traffic northbound. The total project cost was over \$20,000, but thanks to WNA members, volunteer labor, and the Carrollton Grant program, the total outlay from the Woodcreek Neighborhood Association was only \$2,000.

Last year we asked you to identify issues that needed addressing in 2018. The most urgent of these was the commercial traffic flowing through Woodcreek north to the office buildings. WNA board members worked with the City and now there is a "NO THRU TRAFFIC" sign in place. In addition, Carrollton Police have increased surveillance and are issuing tickets to violators.

This year we again ask you to tell us what improvements you deem most important. Outstanding projects already identified are:

- Painting of the street light poles.
- · Repairing and repainting the Woodcreek bridge
- Cleaning and touching up of the Woodcreek South entrance signs
- Long-term planning for creek renovations and improvements
- Continued monitoring of City ordinances affecting our neighborhoods

There likely aren't any grants for the items listed above. The costs for these projects come from your membership dues.



2018 Santa Parade - December 15, 2018

The parade will begin at 10:00 a.m. at Woodcreek and Valley Mill on the north side and then start again at about 10:35 a.m. at Creekview and Kelly for the southern half on the neighborhood. The parade will make brief stops along the route so that Santa can take pictures with you and your family, so be sure to have a camera ready to snap your pics with the jolly old elf. **Please note:** if weather conditions are bad at parade time, the parade will be canceled and not rescheduled.

We will also be collecting non-perishable food and cash/check donations for Metrocrest Services. Hand your donations to one of Santa's helpers along the parade route or leave it at the curb for pickup

WOODCREEK CUT-THROUGH TRAFFIC Al Overholt



The city recently installed a sign at the Woodcreek Street entrance from Kelly Blvd. that reads NO THRU TRAFFIC. This is another step in our efforts to deter vehicles from using Woodcreek as a cut-thru to access the commercial properties off Driftwood. The Carrollton Police have also issued citations for violations of the turn restrictions posted on Driftwood. Citations serve to reduce the traffic but need to be repeated periodically.

City of Carrollton Grant Project – Completed!

Last fall we began a project to build a new monument sign at the Woodcreek Street entrance with support from a city matching grant. On October 21, 2017, we started the work and held an old-fashioned Oktoberfest celebration. We are happy to report that the project is complete and the new sign is in place to welcome residents and visitors alike.

In addition to the sign we added LED lighting, expanded the irrigation system, added new landscaping, new sod and installed new LED lighting on the walking bridge across the creek. Woodcreek residents volunteered 2,000 hours of labor to the project. Some of the activities contributed were trimming trees, removing the old landscaping, installing the new landscaping and edging, installing new sod, repairing the irrigation system and power washing the stone wall. Many additional hours were volunteered for planning the project and working with the contractors.

In addition, residents donated \$684 worth of material and equipment. The members of the Woodcreek Neighborhood Association donated \$2,172 to the project thru their membership dues. All together with the city's grant contribution, the total project cost was just over \$20,000.

I appreciate everyone who contributed toward the project. Thanks to Liz Messner who created and presented a very professional grant request to the city. And finally, a special thanks to our Gold

and Silver members who made the project possible thru their generous contributions.

Safety in Woodcreek

We are fortunate that Woodcreek is a safe neighborhood. Our safety is in part due to the diligence of home owners and conscientious neighbors who watch out for each other's property. If you wonder what the data says about crime in our neighborhood, the WNA Board wanted to provide a resource for you.

To search for crime information, visit https://communitycrimemap.com/. You set it up so that a monthly report is emailed to you. Here is an example from the last 3 months of the information available:

Woodcreek Neighborhood Association is lucky to have two Citizen's Patrol Members from the Carrollton Police Department living in our community—DeWayne Tallmon and Jon Ortega. Here's what Jon Ortega has to say about the safety of our neighborhood.

"My personal observation has been that the Woodcreek neighborhood is a very safe place to live. The police say that many burglaries are crimes of opportunity where citizens have left vehicles unlocked and/or valuables in plain sight or neglecting to close the garage door. An open garage door, even during the day when someone is home is an invitation to a criminal. It takes mere seconds to walk into a garage and take valuables. Since I often work late hours and return late at night, I will often drive the alleys of Woodcreek. About 20% of the time, I will come across an open garage door well after midnight. On those occasions, I advise the police who will come out and advise the resident of the situation."

Current Watering Regulations

At this time, the City of Carrollton is operating under the strategies of our most current Water Conservation Plan adopted on April 15, 2014. Our water supplier, Dallas Water Utilities, has not implemented emergency water use restrictions at this time, so we are not currently in any kind of emergency response stage.

Seasonal Water Demand Strategies begin on April 1 and will be in place through October 31. Use of automatic irrigation systems is prohibited between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. We ask that our water customers voluntarily keep their outdoor watering to no more than twice per week in the absence of rainfall.

With the increasing value of homes in Woodcreek, more residents are interested in expediting the projects to enhance our neighborhood. But we can only accomplish these as our budget permits. Since our base dues are a fraction of most associations, many residents are willing to contribute additional money to help accomplish these projects faster.

Two additional levels of membership are provided for those who would like to invest more in our neighborhood. The extra funds will enable Woodcreek to complete needed projects at faster pace.
